Side effects!), journal entries that she forgot she wrote (yes, chemo brain is real), and pictures of her roboboobs and mastectomy vest of doom. She admits that she loved being bald, confronts her physical deformity, worries over never having normal sex again, rails against chemically-induced menopause, and relives telling her three-year-old daughter that something is wrong with Mommy without cluing her in to the fact that Mommy thinks she might die. In the end, after detailing exactly how she thinks she has stayed alive for the last 10 years (and counting!) and what you should and should not do when someone you love has cancer, Marnie wraps it all up with an excellent cookie recipe and the confession that she just wants her nipples back. Written with heart and humor, through tears and laughter, this memoir will strike a chord with anyone battling, surviving, or touched by cancer.

The story speeds along with tantalizing twists and turns until the prophecies are fulfilled, true identities are revealed, and all is resolved in a totally satisfying, breathtaking, surprise-filled ending.

Someone Else's Skin

Introducing Detective Inspector Marnie Rome *Penguin*

Winner of the Theakstons Old Peculier Crime Novel of the Year Award and Nominated for a Macavity Award for Best First Mystery Novel No two victims are alike. DI Marnie Rome knows this better

than most. Five years ago, her family home was the scene of a shocking and bloody crime that left her parents dead and her foster brother in prison. Marnie doesn't talk much about her personal life, preferring to focus on work. Not even her partner, DS Noah Jake, knows much about Marnie's past. Though as one of the few gay officers on the force and half Jamaican to boot, Noah's not one to overshare about his private life either. Now Marnie and Noah are tackling a case of domestic violence, and a different brand of victim. Hope Proctor stabbed her husband in desperate self-defense. A crowd of witnesses in the domestic violence shelter where she's staying saw it happen, but none of them are telling quite the same story, and the simple question remains: how did Leo Proctor get in to the secure shelter? Marnie and Noah shouldn't even have been there when it happened but they were interviewing another resident, Ayana Mirza. They're trying to get Ayana to testify against her brothers for pouring bleach on her face for bringing dishonor the family, and blinding her in one eye. But Ayana knows that her brothers are looking for her, and she has no doubt that they'll kill her this time. As the violence spirals, engulfing the residents of the women's shelter, Marnie finds herself drawn into familiar territory: A place where the past casts long shadows and she must tread carefully to survive.

100 Animated Feature Films *Bloomsbury Publishing*

Twenty years ago, animated features were widely perceived as cartoons for children. Today, though, they encompass an astonishing range of films, styles and techniques. There is the powerful adult drama of *Waltz with Bashir*; the Gallic sophistication of *Belleville Rendez-Vous*; the eye-popping violence of Japan's *Akira*; and the stop-motion whimsy of *Wallace & Gromit in The Curse of the Were-Rabbit*. Andrew Osmond provides an entertaining and illuminating guide to the endlessly diverse world of animated features, with entries on 100 of the most interesting and important animated films from around the world, from the 1920s to the present day. There are key studio brands such as Disney, Pixar and Dreamworks, but there are also recognised auteur directors such as America's Brad Bird (*The Incredibles*) and Japan's Hayao Miyazaki (*Spirited Away*).

Technologies such as motion-capture, used in films such as *Avatar*, blur the distinctions between live-action and animation. Meanwhile, lone artists such as Nina Paley (*Sita Sings the Blues*) and Bill Plympton (*Idiots and Angels*) make entire films by themselves. Blending in-depth history and criticism, *100 Animated Feature Films* balances the blockbusters with local success stories from Eastern Europe to Hong Kong. There are entries on Dreamworks' *Shrek*, Pixar's *Toy Story*, and Disney's *The Jungle Book*, but you will also find pieces on Germany's silhouette-based *The Adventures of Prince Achmed*, the oldest surviving animated feature; on the thirty year production of Richard Williams' legendary opus, *The Thief and the Cobbler*; and on the lost work of Argentina's Quirino Cristiani, who reputedly made the first animated feature in 1917.
